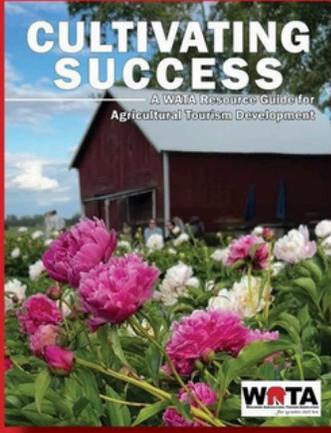

Act 73 Trailer Bill - Save Wisconsin Wedding Barns!

Act 73, slated to go into effect on January 1, 2026, will decimate wedding barns and other farm event venues, which are a growing segment of Wisconsin's agricultural tourism industry.

Act 73 incorrectly expands the long-standing definition of "public places" to include privately-owned event venues and restricting such venues to either operating as a tavern/pub with a Class-B liquor licensing or to operating on no more than six days per year and a maximum of one day per month. With this restriction in place, family farms won't be able to meet demand for their venues and reduces the ability for farms to generate supplemental income.

A trailer bill would update Act 73 by **increasing the number of events that no-sale event venue permit holders could host from six to 36.**

This simple numerical change would enable many family farms to diversify and supplement their incomes, which would help keep Wisconsin farmland in production and ensure that farm family legacies are protected.

In the News...

On December 12, 2025, lawmakers introduced **Senate Bill 739** (also see companion bill **Assembly Bill 748**)—legislation that could significantly reshape how homemade foods are produced and sold in our state.

These bills overhaul the rules for selling **home-prepared pickled fruits and vegetables**, as well as **baked goods and other shelf-stable foods** made in private kitchens. Under the proposed changes, home food producers would be required to **register with DATCP and obtain a registration number**, **carry liability insurance**, and comply with **inspection requirements based on annual gross sales**. For anyone currently earning income—or planning to—from home-baked or



pickled goods, these proposals could have real and immediate consequences. Review Senate Bill 739 and Assembly Bill 748 carefully, consider how the changes may impact your livelihood, and **make your voice heard**. If any part of this legislation would negatively affect your ability to earn an income from your home kitchen, contact your **State Senator and Assembly Representative** and let them know. Your input matters!
